Spotlight on Ms. Lucy Warner!

Fresh from moving back to San Antonio after living in New York City for many years, Lucy Warner joins our Acorn family as an Assistant Teacher for the Blue Stars. After teaching music to grades K-5 for three years in NEISD, she earned her Master's degree in Musicology at the Eastman School of Music in Rochester, NY, then moved to Manhattan and earned her living as a professional singer/guitarist and composer based in New York City, traveling nationally and internationally as a soloist and with her own band, recording five albums of original songs as well as performing at concerts and events with various other bands and orchestras including the Lester Lanin Orchestra.

In her subsequent career as a music teacher, Lucy was the K-4 Music Specialist, Director of After School Music, and Music Department Head at The Browning School on Manhattan's Upper East Side.

Her most recent teaching experience includes being an assistant pre-school teacher for 4-5-year-old students at the Garden House School in Manhattan.

During her teaching days at The Browning School, Lucy pioneered a 'Famous Composers' program into the elementary music curriculum, enabling her students to discover a variety of musical genres and musicians - from Bach and Beethoven to Bonnie Raitt and Bob Marley. One of her goals was to find an exciting book geared to pre-school and elementary school-aged children. That is how her series Zap! Superheroes of Music was born. To date, there are three ZAP! Books, each featuring twelve famous composers – each a superhero, with a special musical super power.

Based on the first book, the San Diego Symphony produced kidfriendly videos reading Zap! Boom! Pow! Superheroes of Music online.

Inspired by one of Mexico's greatest stories, Lucy recently expanded an original solo show into a two-act musical. It features twenty-one songs in English with Spanish highlights and a unique cast of characters. It is now ready for production. Stay tuned!
